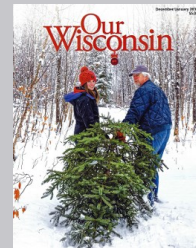

For those new to the area, you will need the following information: Name/Address, DNR Registration number, Expiration date, Trailer and Boat make.
