Rhinelanders Suspends Walk-In Services

The City of Rhinelander has suspended walk-in services at municipal buildings due to the sustained rise in COVID-19 Cases in Oneida County. City Hall, Police, Fire and Inspection Offices will be closed to the public effective Monday, November 16th, 2020.

“The City’s utmost priority is keeping people safe while continuing to provide services and carry out its functions,” said Mayor Frederickson. “Wear a mask while in public, practice good hygiene and avoid gatherings of people outside your immediate family whenever possible,” he added.

City Staff will continue to process bill payments, license applications, permits and other documents. The public may use the Drop box outside of City Hall- South Pelham Street, the mail or make utility payments electronically at: bit.ly/RhiUtility.

Public meetings will remain open to the public with social distancing practiced, however, the public is encouraged to watch meetings livestreamed or on demand at HodagTV.com. Department and Alderperson contact information can be viewed online at rhinelandercityhall.org.
